## Summer Safari Intern Description

### General Summary

Summer Safari interns will have the opportunity to gain experience in environmental and conservation education by utilizing the Zoo as an active, living classroom.

This is a seasonal position that runs from June through the first week of August (off the week of July 4<sup>th</sup>) with a 20-25 hour per week commitment. Summer Safari serves roughly 300 campers. Campers are divided into groups based on grade levels (Kindergarten, First/Second Grade, Third/Fourth Grade, Fifth/ Sixth Grade, and Seventh/Eighth Grade), and each group has one teacher and one teacher aide (intern) in addition to teen volunteers. The teacher to student ratio is 1:20 (1:15 for Kindergarten). This position requires a high level of enthusiasm and energy, creativity, flexibility, and the ability to work with groups of all ages in both in and outdoor settings.

### Primary Duties and Responsibilities

- Program facilitation and preparation: set-up and break-down of facilities and materials in assigned classrooms and other in-zoo sites used in camp programs.
- Assist Summer Safari teachers in daily instruction of weekly camp programs for ages 5-14.
- May have the opportunity of working closely with Education Curator in an administrative role.
- Abide by all Alexandria Zoo policies and procedures, including safety protocol and wearing appropriate Zoo uniform.
- Inform Education Curator or supervisor on duty if any emergencies arise.
- Assist with camper drop-off and pick-up.
- Other duties as assigned.

### Qualifications

- Must be at least 18 years of age.
- Enjoy working with children and around animals.
- Good communication and leadership skills.
- Ability to lift 50 pounds and willing to work outside.
- Commitment of the entire Summer Safari term (6/6 – 8/5), 5 days/week (Monday through Friday) from 8:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m.
- Attendance at Summer Safari intern Orientation required.
- Able to work cooperatively with staff and volunteers.
- Interest and passion for conservation, biological diversity, conservation education, and the natural world.
- Candidates should be enthusiastic, creative, and self-motivated.

### Work Environment

Exposure to outdoor central Louisiana weather conditions such as heat, humidity, and rain will be required.

### Physical Demands

- Able to remain on feet and walk for extended periods of time.
- Frequently bend, stoop, reach, lift heavy objects, and climb.

### Supervision

The position reports directly to the Education Curator.

### Salary

Summer Safari interns will receive \$8 per hour.
